Thanks to this Privacy Policy, you will be informed about the data processing of the Company Agilitation, whose head office is located at 15 rue du général Campredon 34000 Montpellier, France, registered in the Montpellier Trade and Companies Register under number 821 947 009.

1. Data Controller



Agilitation is responsible for the processing of personal data that it carries out on its websites and/or for its own needs.

When a client company of Agilitation installs one of our tools (widget cookies, contractual consent modules etc.) on their website or mobile application, this Company acts as a data controller concerning the resulting data processing. If you want to know more, we invite you to read the privacy policies that they publish on their services.

Agilitation can provide courses or training sessions on behalf of schools and other organizations. These schools and organizations are responsible for the processing of students' personal data, with Agilitation acting as a mere subprocessor.

2. What data do we collect?



We collect and process the personal data of :

- our websites and services' final users;
- our suppliers and partners ;
- prospects, customers ;
- applicants for a position within Agilitation.

a. Data collected when you create a customer account or when you contact us

When you create an account or when you subscribe to one of our offers, you will have to provide us with personal data: your name, your contact information (email address, postal address and telephone number) and your banking information.

We also collect your data when you contact us: by sending a contact form, during a phone call or by giving us your contact information or a business card, during a trade show for example.

During telephone or video calls, we may record the conversation in order to train our staff and improve the quality of our services. We will let you know when the recording starts so that you can object to this by informing the phone operator.

We also collect information from you if you agree to complete our surveys to help us improve our products and services.

b. Automatically collected data - cookies and other tracking tools

When you browse our websites or services, we automatically collect certain information such as:

- the device, the operating system and browser used;
- the IP address and/or user ID;
- the date and time of your navigation;
- the pages you have visited, your browsing history, bugs and errors you may have encountered during your browsing.

As required by applicable regulations, we will ask for your consent to process some of this information collected through cookies and trackers on our websites and services. To find out more, please see the "Cookies" section below.

c. Data we collect from third parties

Your data may be collected from:

- Social network providers (Meta Facebook, Google) when you create an account on our back-office, using this authentication method;
 - Your digital agency, when you entrust them with the management of your website's cookies and they invite you to create a user account on our back-office. Please note that your line manager may also do the same;
 - Our marketing and sales partners. For example, when we co-organize a webinar, we may receive participant data.
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3. Why and how we process your personal data?

4. Who is the recipient of the personal data collected?



Agilitation does not sell your personal data to third parties. We may share data for the sole purpose of our activities:

- Internally, with the departments authorized to carry out these missions;
- With suppliers and subcontractors. Agilitation has them sign contracts that include clauses that ensure a high level of data protection, of confidentiality and of security. These clauses comply with regulatory standards and they reflect the latest in policy and judicial norms.
- With partners whom we invite when we organize an event or who invite us to an external event (webinar, speaking engagement, etc.).

Your data may be communicated to the competent public authorities at their request, in compliance with the regulations, in particular in order to search for the perpetrators of offences.

5. Is your personal data transferred outside the European Union?



Agilitation works with subcontractors and suppliers under conditions that may lead to this type of data transfer.

We implement all necessary technical, organizational and legal measures to ensure that these transfers are safe (in particular we may sign data protection agreements, standard contractual clauses). We evaluate our subcontractors. They may also apply adequacy decisions in accordance with Article 45 of the GDPR.

6. What are your rights and how to exercise them?



In accordance with articles 15 to 22 of the GDPR, you have the following rights:

- right of access (article 15 of the GDPR)
- right of rectification (article 16 of the GDPR)
- right to erasure (article 17 of the GDPR)
- right to limitation of processing (article 18 of the GDPR)
- right to notification of rectification, erasure, limitation of processing (Article 19 of the GDPR)
- right to data portability (article 20 of the GDPR)
- right to object (article 21 of the GDPR)
- right not to be profiled (article 22 of the GDPR)

You can exercise these rights:

- By clicking on the unsubscribe links available at the bottom of newsletters and marketing emails if you no longer wish to receive them;
- If you are a customer, [by logging into your administration area and contacting our support](#);
- By letting your interviewer know if you do not agree to take part in our satisfaction surveys;

You may be asked to provide us with a proof of identity if necessary in order to ensure that the request is made by the legitimate owner of the data concerned.

You also have the right to file a complaint with the Commission Nationale de l'Informatique et des Libertés (CNIL).

7. Cookies



The website and our services may automatically collect standard information such as all types of personalized information that allows the site to identify its visitors.

You can also choose whether or not to allow them by activating our widget to do so. We retain your cookie preferences for up to 6 months.

In particular, We use Contentsquare on our website to create a better digital experience for our visitors' and to optimize our services and your interactions with them. Contentsquare is an Experience Analytics and Monitoring tool that helps us better understand our visitors' online experiences and visualize how our visitors interact with our website to identify issues and friction points by reconstructing individual visitor sessions (Session Replay). To provide these services, Contentsquare uses first-party cookies and other technologies to process personal data of our visitors' behavior and their devices on our behalf. This may include data like online identifiers (e.g. device's IP address, user ID), identification data (e.g. name, email address, only if we explicitly collect it), technical data (e.g. device type and screen size, browser information), geographic location (country only) and behavioral data (interactions with our website such as clicks, taps, scrolls, accessibility needs). We keep this information for a maximum of one year.
